AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE CONTENTS OF NOMINATION PAPERS FOR PUBLIC OFFICE.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 The first paragraph of section 45 of chapter 53 of the General
2 Laws, as most recently amended by section 1 of chapter 336 of the
3 acts of 1979, is hereby further amended by striking out the third
4 sentence and inserting in place thereof the following sentence: —
5 The candidate may state, on one or more nomination papers, in not
6 more than eight words, any of the following public offices which he
7 holds or has held: those offices which are voted for at state primaries,
8 mayor, city councillor, alderman, town councillor, selectman,
9 school committee member or any other city or town elective office.
