## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Eighty.

AN ACT PROVIDING THAT CERTAIN PUBLIC BUILDINGS SHALL NOT BE SUBJECT TO THE PROVISIONS OF THE STATE BUILDING CODE.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 All public buildings except those used for human habitation but  
2 including all those originally constructed or purchased for use by  
3 the commonwealth or any of its political subdivisions and still used  
4 for same are hereby exempt from the provisions of sections 605.21  
5 and 605.32 of the State Building Code provided said public build-  
6 ings were erected or purchased by the commonwealth or any of its  
7 political subdivisions at least fifty years before adoption of said  
8 State Building Code as authorized by chapter eight hundred and  
9 two of the acts of nineteen hundred and seventy-two and at least  
10 twenty-five years before the adoption of chapter one hundred and  
11 forty-three.
