AN ACT RELATIVE TO TRAVELING EXPENSES.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 General Laws, Chapter 221, section 99, as most recently amend-
2 ed by Section 259 of Chapter 478 of the Acts of 1978, is hereby
3 amended by striking out section 99, as so appearing, and inserting
4 in place thereof the following section: —

5 *Section 99.* Clerks and assistant clerks of courts shall receive
6 from the commonwealth the amount of expenses, including travel
7 expenses, necessarily incurred by them in the discharge of their
8 duties.

9 Such expenses must be accounted for upon an itemized state-
10 ment to the administrative justices of the respective court depart-
11 ments. Such expenses shall be approved and certified by said
12 administrative justices.
