AN ACT RELATIVE TO MUNICIPAL INDEBTEDNESS AS IT RELATES TO WATER SUPPLY.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Section 8 of chapter 44 of the General Laws is
2 hereby amended by striking out clause (3) and inserting in place
3 thereof the following new clause;

4 (3) For establishing or purchasing a system for supplying a
5 city, town or district and its inhabitants with water, for taking
6 or purchasing water sources, either from public land or private
7 sources, or water or flowage rights for the purpose of a public water
8 supply, or for taking or purchasing land for the protection of a
9 water system, thirty years, provided, however that a federal loan
10 granted under the Consolidated Farmers Home Administration
11 Act P.L. 92-419 shall be payable at the time required by such loan.

1 SECTION 2. Said section of said chapter is hereby further
2 amended by adding at the end of clause (4) the following words:
3 provided however that a federal loan granted under the Consoli-
4 dated Farmers Home Administration Act P.L. 92-419 shall be
5 payable at the time required by such loan.

1 SECTION 3. Said section of said chapter is hereby further
2 amended by striking out clause (4A) and inserting in place thereof
3 the following new clause:

4 (4A) For remodeling, reconstructing or making extraordinary
5 repairs to reservoirs and filter beds, such amounts as may be
6 approved by the emergency finance board, ten years; provided,
7 however, that no indebtedness shall be incurred hereunder until
8 plans relating to the project shall have been submitted to the
9 department of environmental quality engineering and the depart-
10 ment of public health, and the approval of said departments has

11 been granted therefor, provided, however that a federal loan grant-
12 ed under the Consolidated Farmers Home Administration Act
13 P.L. 92-419, shall be payable at the time required by such loan.

1 SECTION 4. Said section of said chapter is hereby further
2 amended by adding at the end of clause (5) the following words: —
3 provided, however that a federal loan granted under the Consoli-
4 dated Farmers Home Administration Act P.L. 91-419, shall be
5 payable at the time required by such loan.

1 SECTION 5. Said section of said chapter is hereby further
2 amended by adding at the end of clause (6) the following words: —
3 provided, however that a federal loan granted under the Consoli-
4 dated Farmers Home Administration Act P.L. 92-419, shall be
5 payable at the time required by such loan.

1 SECTION 6. Said section of said chapter is hereby further
2 amended by adding at the end of clause (7) the following words: —
3 provided, however, that a federal loan granted under the Consoli-
4 dated Farmers Home Administration Act P.L. 92-419 shall be
5 payable at the time required by such loan.

1 SECTION 7. Said section of said chapter is hereby further
2 amended by adding at the end of clause (7A) the following
3 words: — provided, however that a federal loan granted under the
4 Consolidated Farmers Home Administration Act P.L. 92-419,
5 shall be payable at the time required by such loan.

1 SECTION 8. Said section of said chapter is hereby further
2 amended by adding at the end of clause (7B) the following
3 words: — provided, however that a federal loan granted under the
4 Consolidated Farmers Home Administration Act P.L. 92-419,
5 shall be payable at the time required by such loan.
