The committee on Health Care, to whom were referred the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 3198) of Andrew J. Rogers, Jr., for legislation to provide that all abortions be performed in hospitals; the petition (accompanied by bill, House No. 5145) of Andrew J. Rogers, Jr., for legislation to regulate the location of abortion clinics; and the petition (accompanied by bill, House No. 5671) of William J. Flynn, Jr., for legislation relative to regulating abortions, reports recommending that the accompanying order (House, No. 6515) ought to be adopted.

Ordered, That the committee on Health Care is hereby authorized to conduct a study of the medical procedure known as abortion and of the settings in which abortions are performed; said study to include an examination of the subject matter of the current House document number; 3198, relative to providing that all abortions be performed in hospitals; 5145, relative to the regulation of the location of abortion clinics; 5671, relative to regulating abortions. Said committee may report from time to time, by filing its recommendations, together with drafts of legislation, if any, with the clerk of the House of Representatives, on or before the first Wednesday of December, nineteen hundred and eighty.
