AN ACT

Defining a Portion of the Boundary Line between the Towns of Sandisfield and Tolland.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1 SECT. 1. That part of the dividing line between
2 the towns of Sandisfield and Tolland, from the line
3 of the State of Connecticut to the stone monu-
4 ment on the east bank of Farmington River, near the
5 dwelling house of Elizur Deming, is established and
6 described as follows, to wit: Beginning at a stone
7 monument on the east bank of Farmington River, a
8 short distance southerly from the dwelling house of
9 Elizur Deming; thence south to the thread of said

10 Farmington River; thence southerly in the thread of
11 said Farmington River to the line of the State of
12 Connecticut.

1 SECT. 2. This act shall take effect from and after
2 its passage.
