Madam:- In compliance with the requirements of Chapter 112, of the General Laws, the Board of Registration in Veterinary Medicine submits its annual report for the fiscal year 1942.

Twenty-nine persons have applied for registration during the year, all of whom were graduates of veterinary schools. Two of these applicants were refused registration in 1940, and one of these two again in 1941. Each applied for re-examination this year. All of the applicants appeared for examination, and sixteen of them succeeded in securing registration as a result of this examination.

The number of persons examined this year is twenty-nine, and the results are given in the following table:

Since the organization of the Board, January 1, 1904, 670 certificates of registration have been issued.

During the year, the Board has held six meetings and one examination.

According to the rules of the Board, all applications for examination must be made upon blanks furnished for this purpose by the Secretary, and returned to him at least three days before the date of the examination, properly executed and accompanied by a fee of fifteen dollars and proof of the applicant's citizenship. A ticket of admission to the examination, showing the date and the applicant's number, is issued upon receipt of this application. Tickets are also issued to rejected applicants entitled to re-examination if applied for three days before the examination. By a ruling of the Board, if there are a sufficient number of applicants, examinations are held twice annually. The law requires that these examinations shall be wholly or in part in writing, in the English language, and shall be of a scientific and practical character. They shall include the subjects of anatomy, physiology, surgery, animal parasites, obstetrics, pathology, bacteriology, diagnosis and practice, therapeutics, materia medica, and veterinary dentistry, and shall be sufficiently thorough to test the applicant's fitness to practice veterinary medicine. There is usually an average of eight questions in each subject, and the answer of each question is marked on a scale of 0 to 100, after which the applicant's general average is computed. In this connection, it should be borne in mind that the name of the applicant is unknown to any examiner, except the secretary. Each examination book bears a number, upon which the examiner reports his rating.

Since its organization, the Board has held 66 examinations.

During the life of the Board, there have been 832 applicants for registration in veterinary medicine; of this number, 670 were granted registration, 155 were refused registration, and 9 have not appeared for examination.

The following table lists the veterinary schools from which the applicants were graduated, and the results of their examinations. The table also lists the number of non-graduates who have been registered, and those refused registration.

For the purpose of convenience, the "Correspondence School" is listed as a school, although it was not chartered, and had no right to issue degrees. It is to be noted that fourteen men, graduates of this school, who assumed that they had received a proper training in veterinary medicine, have been examined, yet failed by our examinations to demonstrate any knowledge of veterinary science. The result shows the absolute impracticability of teaching veterinary medicine by correspondence.
