AN ACT PROHIBITING TETHERING, LEASHING, AND OTHER RESTRAINTS OF PRISONERS IN WORK RELEASE PROGRAMS.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority
of the same, as follows:*

- 1 SECTION 1. Chapter 127 of the General Laws is hereby amended by inserting the following new section:—
2 Section 49C. No prisoner in the care and custody of the department of correction, nor county corrections
3 participating in any work or employment program outside the institution to which he or she stands committed shall
4 be subjected to any physical “proactive restraints”, so-called, including, but not limited to, chains and other linkage
5 or tethering devices, stun guns, so-called, and any mechanisms which deliver a current of electricity to the person.
