AN ACT RELATIVE TO COLLECTIVE BARGAINING.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 **SECTION 1.** The second paragraph of section 12 of chapter 150E of the General Laws, as
2 appearing in the 2006 Official Edition, is hereby amended by adding the following subparagraph:-

3 If an agency service fee is not negotiated in the collective bargaining agreement
4 the fair share provision shall apply to any employee who chooses not to join the
5 union by paying to the union a percentage equal for negotiations for wages, benefits and working
6 conditions and grievance and arbitration rights. Failure of an employee to pay the fair share
7 provision shall exclude him from any and all relief of the collective bargaining agreement with
8 the exception of the negotiated COLA increases.
