36th ANNUAL REPORT OF THE DIRECTOR OF REGISTRATION

To HIS EXCELLENCY, GOVERNOR CHRISTIAN A. HERTER, and THE HONORABLE SENATE AND HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES:

Gentlemen:- The Director of Registration, Department of Civil Service and Registration respectfully submits to you the thirty-seventh annual report of the Division of Registration. As in previous years, the reports of the various Boards of this Division,— the Board of Registration of Architects, the Board of Registration of Barbers, the Board of Registration of Certified Public Accountants, the Board of Registration in Chiropody-Podiatry, the Board of Dental Examiners, the State Examiners of Electricians, the Board of Registration in Embalming and Funeral Directing, the Board of Registration of Professional Engineers and of Land Surveyors, the Board of Registration in Medicine, the Medicine Approving Authority, the Board of Registration in Nursing, the Nursing Approving Authority, the Board of Registration in Optometry, the Board of Registration in Pharmacy, the Board of Registration in Veterinary Medicine, the Veterinary Medicine Approving Authority, are submitted to the Director and will be printed in separate pamphlets. The Board of Registration of Hairdressers and the Board of State Examiners of Plumbers are not required by law to make an annual report.

During the past year the boards of examination and registration have performed their administrative, judicial and executive duties regulating their respective professions and trades, efficiently and economically. The members of these eighteen boards have given full attention to applicants for registration and re-registration. Their competent and intelligent activities have been an important factor in improving professional standards as well as the protection of public health and well-being.

The investigators of the various boards have been diligent in their field of operation. A number of licenses and certificates have been suspended or revoked for cause. The Department of Public Safety and the Attorney General and his staff have cooperated in the arrests and convictions of violators of the law in the diverse professions and trades.

The Director is appreciative of the loyal and efficient cooperation of the clerical personnel in this Division. However, centralizing the administration of the various boards might achieve substantial economy, eliminating duplication of routine Division work; and establish a more efficient operating status. A continuing study has been carried out relative to processing original applications and renewals through tabulating machines, and we have received appropriations for the initial IBM machine installation.

The Division has been located in cramped quarters for some time. I, therefore, again recommend and request that additional space be assigned so that better service may be given to the public and to the Commonwealth.

The Division of Registration is self-sustaining, and it is pleasing to report that the income of the several boards exceeded the expenditures of the Division by \$66,310.62 as shown on the attached financial statement.
