COMMITTEE ON PUBLIC RELATIONS - David A. O'Malley, Chairman

The Committee on Public Relations through the competent assistance of the Secretary has kept the practitioners of Massachusetts informed through the medium of "Footnotes," the official publication of the Massachusetts Chiroprody Association, on the interesting and vital facts pertaining to the Chiroprody-Podiatry profession.

Due to the exigencies of the war effort, no attempt was made to arrange programs for the general public.

The Committee wishes to extend its appreciation to the Board for the courtesy and consideration shown during the past year.

COMMITTEE ON REGISTRATION - Carleton F. Whitney, Chairman

The Board held one examination on September 22d and 23d, 1943. For this exam, there were 10 applicants of which 7 passed, 1 failed, and 2 did not appear.

Two notices were sent to those chiroprodists who failed to renew their licenses, the final notice having been sent by registered mail. The names of those who failed to respond to the registered notice were then sent to the Department of Public Safety, which has investigated the chiroprodists involved and reported their findings to this Board.

The Board records show that there are 101 chiroprodists in the Armed Forces of the U. S; and in accordance with the Law, these registrants will be able to renew their licenses within six months after they are released from active duty.

The Board has been sending to "Footnotes" each month a list of about 15 or 20 names of chiroprodists carried in the inactive file of the Board office.
