Humphrey L. McCarthy was re-appointed by His Excellency Governor Bradford and confirmed by the Governor's Council on November 21, 1948.

ANNUAL MEETING

The Annual Meeting of the Board was held at the State House, Boston, Mass., on July 14, 1948. Final reports of Committees were received and the following officers were elected for the ensuing year: Herbert L. McCarthy, Secretary and A. Herve Query, Chairman.

ADMINISTRATION

The Board held thirteen meetings and the Annual Meeting. The meetings scheduled for July 13, 1948, November 9, 1948 and for March 14, 1949 were called to order by the Secretary but there being no quorum present, the meeting adjourned on each occasion.

COMMITTEE ON REGISTRATION

The marks of the June 30, July 1 examination were tabulated. Twenty-nine candidates took the examination. Nine passed and twenty failed to pass. An examination was held on November 17, 18, 19, 1948 for which there were ten applicants. Nine of these were for re-examination, two passed and seven failed. One applicant did not qualify for the examination.

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COMMITTEE ON EDUCATION

On September 16, 1948 the Board forwarded Part One of the Curriculum of the Educational Requirements to Deacon Institute of Podiatry. Part Two which completed the requirements was forwarded to the school on June 30, 1949.

Board sent out letters to all states and the District of Columbia asking if they had reciprocity laws. The following information was compiled: twenty-six states have reciprocity laws, including the District of Columbia, fifteen States have no reciprocity laws and eight failed to answer.

PROCTORING COMMITTEE

During the year the Board received seven complaints; six were acted upon by the Board and one was referred to the Massachusetts Chiropractic Association.
