Chap. 39. RESOLVE on the Petition of Charles Brigham, Junior, of Grafton, in the county of Worcester, Trustee of the Hassanamisco Indians.

Guardian of the Grafton Indians empowered to sell certain land, &c.

Resolved, for reasons set forth in the said petition, that Charles Brigham, Junior, of said Grafton, trustee of the Hassanamisco Indians, be, and hereby is, empowered to sell at public auction or private sale, that certain real estate situated in said Grafton, containing about twenty acres, belonging to said tribe of Indians, which was lately occupied by Sarah Phillips, alias Sarah Baston, deceased, and to convey said land by deed duly executed and acknowledged ; and said trustee, out of the proceeds of said sale, may pay the necessary charges of the last sickness, and funeral of the said Sarah, and shall hold the residue of the proceeds of said sale, and invest the same, and shall apply the annual income thereof for the benefit of said Indians, in such manner as shall be approved by the judge of probate for said county of Worcester : *provided*, that the said trustee shall first give bond, with sufficient surety or sureties to the said judge of probate, for the faithful execution of the powers hereby conferred. [*Approved by the Governor, March 21, 1840.*]

Chap. 40. RESOLVES on the Petition of John A. Bolles, of the city of Boston, in the county of Suffolk, Trustee.

Confirmation of appointment of trustee.

Resolved, for reasons set forth in the said petition, that the appointment made by the judge of probate for said county of Suffolk of the said John A. Bolles, of said Boston, to be trustee under the last will of Joseph Bumstead, late of said Boston, bookseller, deceased, be, and the same is hereby confirmed.

New trustees may be appointed.

Resolved, That the judge of probate for the county of Suffolk, for the time being, may appoint a new trustee or trustees under said will, whenever such appointment may be necessary for the proper execution of said trusts ; and every such trustee shall give bond with sufficient surety or sureties, to said judge of probate for the faithful performance of said trust.

Trustee may sell and invest proceeds, &c.

Resolved, That the said John A. Bolles, as such trustee, or his successors in said trust, be authorized and empowered, while holding such trust, to sell at public or private sale, any or all of the real estate which was of the said Joseph Bumstead deceased, and to convey the same by deed or deeds duly executed ; and the said trustee shall hold and invest the proceeds of such sale for the purposes of the trusts created by said will in such manner as shall be approved by the judge of probate for said county of Suffolk : *provided*, the said John A. Bolles, and every trustee subsequently appointed, shall first give bond, with sufficient surety or sureties, to the said judge of probate, for the faithful execution of the powers hereby conferred, and of the trusts under said will.
