

RESOLVE on the Petition of Esther Goodwin.

Resolved, for reasons set forth in the said petition, that there be allowed and paid, out of the treasury of the Commonwealth, to Esther Goodwin, the sum of fifty dollars, in full for services rendered by her husband in the revolutionary war, and that a warrant be drawn therefor. [*Approved by the Governor, Feb. 27, 1841.*]

Chap. 25.

§50 on account of revolutionary services.

RESOLVE on the Petition of Arba Maynard, Treasurer of the town of Southboro'.

Resolved, for reasons set forth in the said petition, that there be allowed and paid, out of the treasury of the Commonwealth, to Arba Maynard, treasurer of Southboro', the sum of twenty dollars and sixty-two cents, in full for moneys paid by him for bounty on wheat, and that a warrant be drawn therefor. [*Approved by the Governor, Feb. 27, 1841.*]

Chap. 26.

§20 62 for bounty on wheat, returned too late for regular legal allowance.

RESOLVE authorizing the sale of certain lands in the town of Roxbury and city of Boston.

Resolved, That the land agent be, and he is hereby authorized, under the direction of the governor and council, to sell, at public auction, or in such other mode as they shall judge for the public interest, the powder magazine on Pine Island, in the town of Roxbury, and the lot of land on which it stands; and also two lots of land situate on South Boston point, in the city of Boston; and, in the name of the Commonwealth, to execute a sufficient deed or deeds to the purchasers; and the said agent shall pay over to the treasurer of the Commonwealth the proceeds of such sales. [*Approved by the Governor, Feb. 27, 1841.*]

Chap. 27.

Land agent authorized to sell certain real estate.

RESOLVE on the Petition of Betsey B. Howe.

Resolved, for reasons set forth in the said petition, that there be allowed and paid, out of the treasury of the Commonwealth, to Betsey B. Howe, the sum of forty dollars, in full compensation for procuring the arrest and conviction of one George Hibbard, alias Booth, a counterfeiter, and that a warrant be drawn therefor. [*Approved by the Governor, Feb. 27, 1841.*]

Chap. 28.

§40 for arrest of a felon who was convicted, but not sentenced.

RESOLVE on the Petition of Waldo T. and Hayward Peirce.

Resolved, for reasons set forth in the said petition, that the treasurer of the Commonwealth be hereby authorized and empowered to give up to Waldo T. and Hayward Peirce, the obligations entered into by them for the purchase of township number seven, in the third range west of the east line of the State of Maine: *provided*, that in consideration thereof, the said Waldo T. and Hayward Peirce, shall convey to the Commonwealth, by a good and sufficient deed, one quarter part of township number six, in the fourth range west of the east line of the State of Maine. [*Approved by the Governor, Feb. 27, 1841.*]

Chap. 29.

Obligations for the purchase of a township to be given up, on condition.

RESOLVE for the payment of Fuel and for other purposes.

Resolved, That there be paid, out of the treasury of the Commonwealth, to Benjamin Stevens, sergeant-at-arms to the general court, the sum of eighteen hundred dollars, to enable him to purchase fuel and other necessary articles for the use of the general
