RESOLVE EXTENDING THE TIME FOR THE REPORT OF THE SPECIAL COMMISSION ESTABLISHED TO CONSIDER THE ENTIRE PROBLEM OF RETIREMENT ALLOWANCES PROVIDED FOR EMPLOYEES OF THE COMMONWEALTH AND OF THE METROPOLITAN DISTRICT COMMISSION UNDER THE STATE RETIREMENT SYSTEM. *Chap. 1*

Resolved, That the time within which the special commission established, under chapter forty-nine of the resolves of nineteen hundred and thirty, to consider the entire problem of retirement allowances provided for employees of the commonwealth and of the metropolitan district commission under the state retirement system, is required to file its report is hereby extended to the first Wednesday in December in the current year.

Resolved, That the armory commissioners are hereby directed to investigate relative to the desirability, necessity and expediency of the construction by the commonwealth in the city of Lynn of a new state armory, or of an addition to the existing state armory therein, for the use of the militia, to replace or supplement said existing armory, and the location and probable cost thereof, including the cost of acquiring such land as may be necessary. Said commissioners are hereby further directed to report to the general court their conclusions and recommendations, if any, with drafts of legislation necessary to carry such recommendations into effect, by filing the same with the clerk of the senate not later than the first Wednesday in December of the current year, and by filing a copy thereof with the budget commissioner.
