

RESOLVES CONCERNING A BUST OF HONORABLE CHARLES SUMNER. *Chap. 37.*

Resolved, That the legislature of Massachusetts, in behalf of the people of the Commonwealth, except from A. A. Lawrence and others, the marble bust of Hon. Charles Sumner; and that the thanks of the legislature, in behalf of the people, be and the same are hereby tendered to said donors for the same.

Resolved, That the niche on the east side of Doric Hall be and hereby is appropriated for the reception of said bust.

RESOLVE IN FAVOR OF THE NEW ENGLAND MORAL REFORM SOCIETY. *Chap. 38.*

Resolved, That there be allowed and paid out of the treasury of the Commonwealth, to the New England Moral Reform Society, the sum of one thousand dollars, for the use of said society for the current year: *provided*, that an equal amount shall be raised for the purposes of the society, from other sources, during the current year, a sworn statement of which shall be made to the auditor of the Commonwealth; and *provided, further*, that the board of state charities shall have power at all times to visit and inspect the institution, and the society shall make an annual report to the board of state charities in accordance with the provisions of chapter two hundred and forty-three of the acts of the year eighteen hundred and sixty-seven.

RESOLVE AUTHORIZING THE SALE OF RAYNSFORD ISLAND. *Chap. 39.*

Resolved, That his excellency the governor is hereby authorized to sell and convey, with the consent of the council, by a good and sufficient warranty deed, the island in Boston harbor called Raynsford Island, with all the buildings thereon, and pay the proceeds of the sale into the state treasury.

Resolved, That the board of state charities are hereby instructed to sell the yacht Thatcher at auction before the first day of June next, and pay the proceeds into the state treasury, and to take charge of all the personal property of the state on the island or belonging there, and either distribute it to the other charitable institutions supported by the state, or sell it, according to their discretion, and to pay the proceeds of any sale into the state treasury.

RESOLVE AUTHORIZING THE ISSUE OF ARMS TO THE ENGLISH HIGH AND LATIN SCHOOLS IN THE CITY OF BOSTON. *Chap. 40.*

Resolved, That his excellency the governor be and is hereby authorized to issue to the city of Boston such arms for the use of the English High and Latin Schools in said city as,
