Chap. 76. RESOLVE IN RELATION TO THE STREET KNOWN AS THE CROSS DAM, IN THE CITY OF BOSTON.

Attorney-general to report concerning cross dam in Suffolk County.

Resolved, That the attorney-general of the Commonwealth examine and report to the next legislature what rights, if any, the Commonwealth and any other parties have in and to the cross dam, so called, in the county of Suffolk, and what are the liabilities of the Commonwealth on account of the same. *Approved June 9, 1869.*

Chap. 77. RESOLVE TO CONFIRM THE ELECTION OF TRUSTEES OF THE SINKING FUND OF THE PLYMOUTH WATER SCRIP.

Election confirmed.

Resolved, That the action of the inhabitants of the town of Plymouth, at their meeting on the fifth day of April last, in the election of Allen Danforth, William H. Nelson and William T. Davis, as trustees of the sinking fund of the Plymouth water scrip, be and the same is hereby ratified and confirmed, and made valid and legal to the same extent as though said trustees had been elected under the provisions of the two hundred and fifty-seventh chapter of the acts of the present year. *Approved June 12, 1869.*

Chap. 78. RESOLVE MAKING ADDITIONAL PROVISION FOR THE ESTABLISHMENT OF BOARDING-HOUSES FOR THE STATE NORMAL SCHOOLS AT BRIDGEWATER AND FRAMINGHAM.

Commissioners of school fund may loan money to board of education.

Resolved, That the commissioners of the Massachusetts school fund be, and they are hereby authorized and directed, with the approval of the governor and council, to loan from said fund to the board of education, in addition to the sums named in the seventeenth chapter of the resolves of the present session, a sum not exceeding ten thousand dollars, for providing and furnishing a boarding-house for the state normal school at Bridgewater; and a sum not exceeding five thousand dollars for a like purpose at the Framingham normal school; said loans to be made upon the terms and conditions expressed in said resolve, chapter seventeen of the present session. *Approved June 12, 1869.*

Chap. 79. RESOLVE IN FAVOR OF THE GUARDIAN OF THE PUNKAPOG TRIBE OF INDIANS, FOR THE BENEFIT OF CERTAIN PERSONS.

Allowance for certain Punkapog Indians.

Resolved, That there be allowed and paid out of the treasury of the Commonwealth, to the guardian of the Punkapog tribe of Indians, for the benefit of the following members of said tribe, the following sums, to wit: for Sally Burr, of Cambridge, the sum of one hundred dollars; for Sally Burr,
