

Chap. 92. RESOLVES IN FAVOR OF SCHOOLS AMONG THE INDIANS OF GAY HEAD.Allowance of
\$150.

Resolved, That there be allowed and paid out of the moiety of the income of the school fund applicable to educational purposes, to the treasurer of the Gay Head district, the sum of one hundred and fifty dollars, to be applied to the support of schools among the Indians of said district; and said treasurer shall, on or before the first day of October next, make a report of the expenditure of said money and the condition of the schools.

Allowance of
\$600.

Resolved, That there be allowed and paid out of the treasury of the Commonwealth, to Richard L. Pease, a sum not exceeding six hundred dollars, for expenses incurred as commissioner to establish boundary lines in the district of Gay Head, and the governor is hereby authorized to draw his warrant for such sum as shall be required, not exceeding the amount aforesaid.

*Approved June 21, 1869.***Chap. 93.** RESOLVE IN RELATION TO THE VENTILATION OF COMMITTEE ROOMS IN THE STATE HOUSE.Expense of ven-
tilation not to
exceed \$5,000.

Resolved, That the sergeant-at-arms, under the direction of the chairmen, on the part of the senate and house of representatives, of the committee on the state house, be authorized and directed to cause the committee rooms needing it to be ventilated, in accordance with the plan proposed by J. H. Shedd, civil engineer: *provided,* that the expense shall not exceed the sum of five thousand dollars.

RESOLVE IN FAVOR OF GRACE C. LOWE.

Resolved, That there be allowed and paid out of the treasury of the Commonwealth, the sum of forty-eight dollars, to Grace C. Lowe, and that from and after July first, eighteen hundred and sixty-nine, she receive the same amount of state aid which she would have been entitled to had she been born while her father was in the military service of the country.

*Approved June 21, 1869.***Chap. 95.** RESOLVE TO AUTHORIZE THE APPOINTMENT OF COMMISSIONERS TO CONSIDER THE EXPEDIENCY OF ESTABLISHING AN INEBRIATE ASYLUM.Three commis-
sioners to be
appointed, to
serve without
compensation.

Resolved, That the governor, with the advice and consent of the council, be and hereby is authorized to appoint three commissioners to consider the expediency of establishing an asylum for inebriates, and also to consider the proposals made to the present legislature, by the trustees of the Washingtonian Home, and report on the whole subject to the governor and council for the benefit of the next legislature; said commissioners shall not be entitled to any compensation for personal services.
