

RESOLVE PROVIDING ADDITIONAL COMPENSATION TO THE DOORKEEPERS, ASSISTANT DOORKEEPERS, MESSENGERS AND PAGES OF THE SENATE AND HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES. *Chap. 66.*

*Resolved,* That in addition to the compensation provided in chapter seven of the acts of the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy-two, there be allowed and paid out of the treasury, to each of the doorkeepers, assistant-doorkeepers and messengers of the senate and house of representatives, the sum of one hundred and thirty-five dollars, and to each of the pages the sum of eighty dollars, for their services for the full session of the present session of the legislature, and in like proportion for any part of the session. Allowance of additional compensation.

RESOLVE INCREASING THE COMPENSATION OF THE SERGEANT-AT-ARMS, THE CLERKS OF THE SENATE AND HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES, AND THE PRIVATE SECRETARY OF THE GOVERNOR. *Chap. 67.*

*Resolved,* That there be allowed and paid to the sergeant-at-arms, to the clerk of the senate and the clerk of the house of representatives, and the private secretary of governor, the sum of five hundred dollars each, for services for the present year, in addition to the sum heretofore allowed, and the same is hereby appropriated. Additional compensation for sergeant-at-arms, clerks, etc.

RESOLVE TO FIX THE COMPENSATION OF THE ASSISTANT CLERKS OF THE SENATE AND HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES. *Chap. 68.*

*Resolved,* That there be allowed and paid out of the treasury, to Hilton F. Hosmer, assistant clerk of the senate, the sum of nine hundred dollars, and to Miss H. L. Robinson, assistant clerk of the house of representatives, the sum of seven hundred and fifty dollars. Compensation of assistant clerk of senate and house.
