And the said commissioners of this Commonwealth are authorized to erect such new monuments as they shall deem necessary for marking the line so recommended in accordance with their said report.

RESOLVE IN FAVOR OF ALONZO D. FISHER.

Resolved, That Alonzo D. Fisher of Edgartown, who served as an ordinary seaman in the United States navy during the war of the rebellion from the thirteenth day of September in the year eighteen hundred and sixty-two to the eleventh day of May in the year eighteen hundred and sixty-four, shall, from and after the passage of this resolve, be eligible to receive state or military aid under the provisions, rules and limitations of chapters two hundred and seventy-nine and three hundred and one of the acts of the year eighteen hundred and eighty-nine, in the same manner and to the same extent he would have been entitled had he served to the credit of this Commonwealth.

Chap. 72 RESOLVE PROVIDING FOR NAILS OR SPIKES FOR DESIGNATING CERTAIN TREES ON HIGHWAYS FOR PRESERVATION.

Resolved, That there be allowed and paid out of the treasury of the Commonwealth a sum not exceeding one hundred dollars, for the purpose of furnishing nails or spikes as provided for in chapter forty-nine of the acts of the present year, entitled "an act relative to preserving ornamental and shade trees on the highways", said nails or spikes to be procured and furnished by the secretary of the state board of agriculture.
