

RESOLVE TO PROVIDE FOR THE PURCHASE OF LAND AND FOR CERTAIN IMPROVEMENTS AT THE MASSACHUSETTS HOSPITAL FOR DIP-SOMANIACS AND INEBRIATES. *Chap. 61*

Resolved, That there be allowed and paid out of the treasury of the Commonwealth a sum not exceeding three thousand five hundred and fifty dollars, to be expended at the Massachusetts hospital for dipsomaniaes and inebriates under the direction of the trustees thereof for the following purposes:— For the construction of a building for workshops, a sum not exceeding two thousand five hundred dollars; for an addition to the piggery, a sum not exceeding six hundred dollars; and for the purchase of land, a sum not exceeding four hundred and fifty dollars. *Massachusetts hospital for dipsomaniaes and inebriates.*

RESOLVE IN FAVOR OF THE STATE NORMAL SCHOOL AT NORTH ADAMS *Chap. 62*

Resolved, That there be allowed and paid out of the treasury of the Commonwealth a sum not exceeding three thousand dollars, to be expended under the direction of the state board of education for grading and other needed improvements upon the grounds of the state normal school at North Adams. *State normal school at North Adams.*

RESOLVE IN FAVOR OF ROBERT J. BARTON. *Chap. 63*

Resolved, That the sum of fifteen dollars be paid out of the treasury of the Commonwealth to Robert J. Barton, a veterinary surgeon, for attendance during the month of September in the year eighteen hundred and ninety-eight upon a sick horse, the said horse being then under the charge of and in use by the Commonwealth. *Robert J. Barton.*

RESOLVE TO AUTHORIZE THE SALE OF CERTAIN VOTING MACHINES BELONGING TO THE COMMONWEALTH. *Chap. 64*

Resolved, That the secretary of the Commonwealth is hereby authorized to sell such voting machines as are now in his custody, the proceeds of the sale to be paid into the treasury of the Commonwealth. *Sale of certain voting machines.*
