*Chap. 75* RESOLVE DIRECTING THE COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MIDDLESEX COUNTY TO INVESTIGATE THE EXPEDIENCY OF WIDENING BRIDGE STREET IN THE CITY OF CAMBRIDGE.

Investigation of expediency of widening Bridge street in Cambridge.

*Resolved,* That the county commissioners of the county of Middlesex are hereby directed to investigate the necessity or expediency, and the probable cost, of widening Bridge street in the city of Cambridge to such a width as the commissioners deem proper, and to report thereon to the next general court, not later than the second Wednesday in January.

*Chap. 76* RESOLVE IN FAVOR OF THE DAUGHTERS OF THOMAS F. PEDRICK, LATE SERGEANT-AT-ARMS OF THE GENERAL COURT.

In favor of daughters of late Thomas F. Pedrick.

*Resolved,* That there be allowed and paid from the treasury of the commonwealth to Alice A. Pedrick and Marion Pedrick, daughters of Thomas F. Pedrick, late sergeant-at-arms of the general court, who died on the twenty-second day of February, nineteen hundred and twenty, the remainder of the salary to which he would have been entitled had he lived and continued to serve until the end of the current year.

*Chap. 77* RESOLVE DIRECTING THE METROPOLITAN DISTRICT COMMISSION TO REPORT A PLAN FOR LIGHTING THE RESERVATIONS, PARKWAYS AND OTHER LANDS UNDER ITS CONTROL.

Metropolitan district commission to report a plan for lighting reservations, etc., under its control.

*Resolved,* That the metropolitan district commission be directed to report to the next general court, on or before the fifteenth day of January, the recommendations of the commission as to a method of lighting the reservations, parkways and other lands under its control, the approximate cost thereof, and such other information on the subject as the commission may deem useful.
