

clerk forthwith upon the designation and appointment of its members. The commission shall be provided with quarters in the state house or elsewhere and may expend in the aggregate for expert, legal and clerical assistance and other expenses the sum of five thousand dollars and such additional sums not exceeding such amount as the governor and council may approve and as may hereafter be appropriated. Any and all money expended under the provisions of this resolve shall be repaid to the commonwealth by said city by the inclusion of the amount thereof in the state tax to be assessed on said city for the year nineteen hundred and thirty-four. The said commission shall report to the general court the results of its study and its recommendations, together with drafts of legislation necessary to carry its recommendations into effect, by filing the same with the clerk of the house of representatives not later than the first Wednesday of December in the current year.

*Chap. 24* RESOLVE PROVIDING FOR AN INVESTIGATION BY THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC WORKS RELATIVE TO CERTAIN PROPOSED TRAFFIC ROUTES.

*Resolved,* That the department of public works is hereby authorized and directed to consider and investigate the location, construction cost and desirability of the following proposed through routes in the metropolitan district:

(a) The completion of the ten mile circumferential highway from its present northern terminus at Worcester street in the town of Wellesley near the Charles river northerly and easterly through the metropolitan district to connect with the main state highways leading to the north;

(b) A route beginning at or near Watertown square and extending along California street and along the banks of the Charles river and westerly to a connection with Weston street and Main street in the western part of Waltham.

Said department shall report to the general court its findings and recommendations, together with drafts of legislation necessary to carry such recommendations into effect, by filing the same with the clerk of the house of representatives not later than the first Wednesday of December in the current year, and shall at the same time file a copy thereof with the budget commissioner.

*Chap. 25* RESOLVE PROVIDING FOR THE WIDENING OF BOYLSTON STREET IN THE TOWN OF CLINTON FOR THE PURPOSE OF ESTABLISHING A PARKING AREA NEAR THE WACHUSETT DAM.

*Resolved,* That department of public works is hereby authorized and directed to widen, to a width of not less than forty feet, Boylston street in the town of Clinton for a dis-
