## AN ACT

To enable Aliens to purchase and hold lands, within this Commonwealth in certain cases.

- 1 SECT. 1. BE it enacted by the Senate and House of
- 2 Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the
- 3 authority of the same, That any person, not a citizen
- 4 of the United States, who now resides, or may here-
- 5 after reside, within this Commonwealth, shall, and
- 6 may be permitted to purchase, hold and convey any
- 7 lands, tenements, and hereditaments within the same;

8 as estate of freehold, and inheritance; and may sell 9 and convey the same, in fee simple, for life or years; 10 and may devise the same by will, and if he shall die 11 intestate, the same shall be distributed to, and 12 among the widow and next of kin of such intestate, 13 in the same manner as if such intestate had been, at 14 the time of his decease, a citizen of the United 15 States; provided, however, that the said Grantees 16 shall always be, at the time of such grants, and de-17 vises, or at the decease of such intestate, residents 18 within this Commonwealth. Provided, always, That 19 all such aliens holding any interest in real estate, as 20 aforesaid, shall be liable to taxation for their polls 21 and estates, in the same manner as citizens of this 22 Commonwealth are, or may be, liable by law to be 23 taxed.

And if such alien, or person born as afore-12 said, shall die intestate, such lands, tenements and 13 hereditaments shall be distributed among the widow, 14 and next of kin of such intestate, in the same man-15 ner, as if such intestate had been a citizen of the 16 United States: *Provided*, nevertheless, that nothing 17 in this act contained shall entitle any alien to any 18 political or civil rights or privileges, to which he 19 would not be entitled if this act had not been made.
