RESOLVE PROVIDING FOR AN INVESTIGATION BY THE JUDICIAL COUNCIL RELATIVE TO CERTAIN EXPENSES OF THE LAND COURT AND TO THE APPORTIONMENT OF COURT EXPENSES. Chap. 39

*Resolved,* That the judicial council be requested to investigate the subject matter of current house document numbered fifteen hundred and seventy-nine relative to certain expenses of the land court and also to investigate the question of a more equitable apportionment of the expenses of the courts of the commonwealth, and to include its conclusions and recommendations in relation thereto, with drafts of such legislation as may be necessary to give effect to the same, in its annual report for the current year.

RESOLVE IN FAVOR OF KATHERINE HALEY.

Chap. 40

*Resolved,* That, for the purpose of discharging a moral obligation of the commonwealth in the premises and after an appropriation therefor has been made, there may be allowed and paid out of the treasury of the commonwealth to Katherine Haley of Skowhegan, Maine the sum of twelve hundred and fifty dollars, to compensate her for injuries received in the performance of her duty as a matron at the industrial school for girls at Lancaster.

RESOLVE AUTHORIZING THE ARMORY COMMISSIONERS TO ACQUIRE LAND IN THE CITY OF NEW BEDFORD FOR ARMORY PURPOSES. Chap. 41

*Resolved,* That, after an appropriation has been made, the armory commissioners are hereby authorized to acquire for garage and gun emplacement purposes, at a cost not to exceed ten thousand dollars, certain land northerly of, and adjacent to, the state armory property in the city of New Bedford; and sections forty and forty-one of chapter thirty-three of the General Laws, as appearing in the Tercentenary Edition, shall, so far as applicable, apply to proceedings taken and acts done under authority of this resolve.
