

RESOLVE PROVIDING THAT A MEMORIAL TABLET BE PLACED *Chap. 55*
 IN THE STATE HOUSE TO COMMEMORATE THE SERVICE AND
 SACRIFICE OF FIRST LIEUTENANT JOHN JOSEPH DEEDY OF
 WORCESTER, A FORMER MEMBER OF THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES.

Resolved, That, after an appropriation shall have been made, the art commission is hereby authorized and directed to procure a suitable memorial tablet commemorating the service and sacrifice of First Lieutenant John Joseph Deedy of Worcester, a member of the military forces of the United States in World War II and a former member of the house of representatives, who was killed in action in France on July twenty-eighth, nineteen hundred and forty-four, and to place the same in the corridor or reading room of the house of representatives, and may expend therefor a sum not exceeding five hundred dollars.

RESOLVE VALIDATING THE ACTS OF EVELYN B. RAFFERTY *Chap. 56*
 OF WEST SPRINGFIELD AS A NOTARY PUBLIC.

Resolved, That the acts of Evelyn B. Rafferty of West Springfield as a notary public between May twenty-fourth, nineteen hundred and forty-three and June first, nineteen hundred and forty-five, both dates inclusive, in so far as the same may have been invalid by reason of the fact that, upon the change of her name from Evelyn F. Boudreau, she failed to re-register under her new name and pay to the state secretary a fee of one dollar as required by section thirteen of chapter thirty of the General Laws, are hereby confirmed and made valid.

RESOLVE PROVIDING FOR AN INVESTIGATION BY THE STATE *Chap. 57*
 BOARD OF HOUSING RELATIVE TO PROVIDING FOR A BUREAU
 OF SAID BOARD TO ACT IN RELATION TO THE PROCUREMENT OF HOMES FOR WAR VETERANS.

Resolved, That the state board of housing is hereby authorized and directed to investigate the subject matter of current house document numbered ten hundred and thirty-one, relative to providing for a bureau of the state board of housing to act in relation to the procurement of homes for war veterans. Said board shall report to the general court the results of its investigation, and its recommendations, if any, together with drafts of legislation necessary to carry such recommendations into effect, by filing the same with the clerk of the house of representatives on or before the first Wednesday of December in the current year.
