

Chap. 71. RESOLVE PROVIDING FOR AN INVESTIGATION AND STUDY BY THE MASS TRANSPORTATION COMMISSION RELATIVE TO AUTHORIZING THE METROPOLITAN DISTRICT COMMISSION TO CONVEY A CERTAIN PARCEL OF LAND LOCATED IN CAMBRIDGE, ARLINGTON AND BELMONT TO THE METROPOLITAN TRANSIT AUTHORITY.

Resolved, That the mass transportation commission is hereby authorized and directed to make an investigation and study of the subject matter of current house document numbered 1511, relative to further authorizing the metropolitan district commission to convey a certain parcel of land located in Cambridge, Arlington and Belmont to the Metropolitan Transit Authority. Said commission shall report to the general court the results of its investigation and study, and its recommendations, if any, together with drafts of legislation necessary to carry its recommendations into effect, by filing the same with the clerk of the house of representatives on or before the last Wednesday of January, nineteen hundred and sixty-four.

Chap. 72. RESOLVE REVIVING AND CONTINUING THE SPECIAL COMMISSION ESTABLISHED TO MAKE AN INVESTIGATION AND STUDY RELATIVE TO AUTHORIZING PUBLIC UTILITY COMPANIES TO GRANT REDUCED RATES TO THEIR EMPLOYEES AND RETIRED EMPLOYEES.

Resolved, That the unpaid special commission established by chapter eighty-six of the resolves of nineteen hundred and sixty-two is hereby revived and continued.

Chap. 73. RESOLVE PROVIDING FOR AN INVESTIGATION AND STUDY BY THE RETIREMENT LAW COMMISSION RELATIVE TO THE RETIREMENT OF EMPLOYEES OF THE MASSACHUSETTS PARKING AUTHORITY.

Resolved, That the retirement law commission is hereby authorized and directed to make an investigation and study of so much of the subject matter of current house document numbered 1228, as relates to the retirement of employees of the Massachusetts Parking Authority. Said commission shall report to the general court the results of its investigation and study, and its recommendations, if any, together with drafts of legislation necessary to carry its recommendations into effect, by filing the same with the clerk of the house of representatives on or before the last Wednesday of January, nineteen hundred and sixty-four.

Chap. 74. RESOLVE PROVIDING FOR AN INVESTIGATION AND STUDY BY A SPECIAL COMMISSION RELATIVE TO ALL PHASES OF OUR CIVIL DEFENSE PROGRAM.

Resolved, That a special commission, to consist of three members of the senate, six members of the house of representatives, the adjutant general, the director of civil defense, and two persons to be appointed by the governor, is hereby established for the purpose of making an
