AN ACT TO ESTABLISH A SINKING FUND FOR THE STATE HOUSE
LOAN DUE IN THE YEAR NINETEEN HUNDRED AND ONE.

Chap. 224

Be it enacted, etc., as follows :

SECTION 1. The treasurer and receiver-general shall at once establish a sinking fund to pay at maturity the scrip or certificates of indebtedness issued for the purchase of land for the extension of the state house, as authorized by chapter three hundred and forty-nine of the acts of the year eighteen hundred and eighty-eight and chapter three hundred of the acts of the year eighteen hundred and eighty-nine.

Sinking fund to be established.

SECTION 2. An amount equal to the total premium received upon the certificates referred to in the preceding section, with interest thereon at the rate of three per cent. to the date of the passage of this act, shall be appropriated and set apart from the treasury to said sinking fund; and each year there shall be raised by taxation and paid into said sinking fund the sum of forty-five thousand dollars.

Total premium received with interest thereon to be appropriated to sinking fund, etc.

SECTION 3. This act shall take effect upon its passage.

AN ACT TO AUTHORIZE THE COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF THE
SEVERAL COUNTIES, EXCEPT SUFFOLK, TO PROVIDE FOR THE
ARRANGING AND INDEXING OF THE PROBATE RECORDS IN THEIR
RESPECTIVE COUNTIES.

Chap. 225

Be it enacted, etc., as follows :

SECTION 1. The county commissioners in each county, except Suffolk, are hereby authorized to cause the files and records of the probate courts therein to be rearranged, indexed and docketed, the dockets worn or defaced to be renewed, and the indexes to be consolidated, under the direction and supervision of the registers of said courts, when in the judgment of said commissioners public convenience demands it.

County commissioners may cause the files and records of probate courts to be indexed and docketed.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its passage.
