

landing at the foot of Jefferson street and the town landing at the foot of Kent street.

SECTION 2. Said city may control and improve for park purposes, not inconsistent with its use as a landing, the town landing at the foot of Kent street, may make regulations for its use as a landing, and may prohibit all parties from depositing refuse thereon or disfiguring the same in any way.

May control and improve for park purposes.

SECTION 3. This act shall take effect upon its passage.

AN ACT TO INCORPORATE THE NEW ENGLAND BURGLARY INSURANCE COMPANY.

*Chap. 77*

*Be it enacted, etc., as follows :*

SECTION 1. William L. Douglas, Hosea Kingman, John J. Whipple, Walter Rapp, Emery M. Low, William R. Mitchell, George D. Alden, Henry L. May, E. Bertram Newton, Samuel M. Child, George R. Stimpson, Emanuel Nussbaum, their associates and successors, are hereby made a corporation by the name of the New England Burglary Insurance Company, to be established in the city of Boston, for the purpose of carrying on the business of guaranteeing individuals, firms and corporations against loss and damage by burglary or housebreaking; and for this purpose shall have all the powers and privileges and be subject to all the duties, restrictions and liabilities, so far as the same shall be applicable, set forth in chapter two hundred and fourteen of the acts of the year eighteen hundred and eighty-seven and all acts in amendment thereof or in addition thereto.

New England Burglary Insurance Company, incorporated.

SECTION 2. The said company shall have a capital stock of two hundred thousand dollars, divided into shares of one hundred dollars each, with the liberty to pay in and increase the same to an amount not exceeding five hundred thousand dollars; and said company may issue policies whenever two hundred thousand dollars of the capital stock shall have been paid in.

Capital stock, etc.

SECTION 3. No policy shall be issued under this act unless the form thereof shall be approved by the insurance commissioner of the Commonwealth.
