AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE AMOUNT OF MONEY TO BE ADVANCED TO THE DISBURSING OFFICER OF THE STATE BOARD OF INSANITY.

*Chap. 54.*

*Be it enacted, etc., as follows :*

SECTION 1. There may be advanced to the disbursing officer of the state board of insanity, under the provisions of chapter fifty-eight of the acts of the year eighteen hundred and ninety, a sum not exceeding fifteen hundred dollars. Such officer, for the faithful discharge of the duties of his office, shall give a bond with sufficient sureties in the sum of two thousand dollars, payable to and to be approved by the treasurer and receiver general.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its passage.

AN ACT MAKING APPROPRIATIONS FOR SALARIES AND EXPENSES AT THE LYMAN SCHOOL FOR BOYS.

*Chap. 55.*

*Be it enacted, etc., as follows :*

SECTION 1. The sums hereinafter mentioned are appropriated, to be paid out of the treasury of the Commonwealth from the ordinary revenue, for the purposes specified, to meet expenses for the year ending on the thirty-first day of December in the year eighteen hundred and ninety-nine, to wit: —

Appropriations.

For the payment of salaries, wages and labor at the Lyman school for boys, a sum not exceeding twenty-eight thousand dollars.

Lyman school for boys.

For current expenses at the Lyman school for boys, a sum not exceeding thirty-eight thousand two hundred and sixty-five dollars.

Expenses.

For salaries and expenses of such agents as the trustees of the Lyman and industrial schools may deem necessary to employ, a sum not exceeding seven thousand dollars.

Agents.

For expenses in connection with boarding out children by the trustees of the Lyman and industrial schools, a sum not exceeding forty-five hundred dollars.

Boarding out children.

For the education and instruction in the public schools in any city or town in the Commonwealth of children

Instruction of certain children.
