

For the Massachusetts Charitable Eye and Ear Infirmary, as authorized by chapter thirty-six of the resolves of the present year, a sum not exceeding twenty-five thousand dollars.

Massachusetts Charitable Eye and Ear Infirmary.

For certain repairs at the reformatory prison for women, as authorized by chapter thirty-seven of the resolves of the present year, a sum not exceeding thirteen hundred and fifty dollars.

Reformatory prison for women.

For certain repairs at the Massachusetts reformatory, as authorized by chapter forty-four of the resolves of the present year, a sum not exceeding twenty-one hundred dollars.

Massachusetts reformatory.

For providing such motors as may be needed for the industries at the Massachusetts reformatory, as authorized by chapter forty-five of the resolves of the present year, a sum not exceeding five thousand dollars.

Massachusetts reformatory.

For the salary of the assistant register of probate and insolvency for the county of Worcester, as authorized by chapter two hundred and sixty-four of the acts of the present year, the sum of five hundred dollars in addition to the eighteen hundred dollars appropriated by chapter thirteen of the acts of the present year.

AN ACT TO AUTHORIZE THE CITY OF BOSTON TO PAY A SUM OF MONEY TO THE CHILDREN OF FREDERIC B. BOGAN.

*Chap. 332*

*Be it enacted, etc., as follows:*

SECTION 1. The city of Boston is hereby authorized to pay to Fred Leo Bogan and Charles Fred Bogan, children of Frederic B. Bogan late superintendent of public buildings of said city, the remainder of the salary to which he would have been entitled had he lived and continued to hold his office until the thirty-first day of January in the year eighteen hundred and ninety-nine.
