

on conviction thereof be imprisoned in the state prison for not more than five years, or in any jail or house of correction not more than three years, or fined not less than one hundred dollars nor more than one thousand dollars.

Penalties.

SECTION 2. All the articles and things described in section one of this act, and all articles of raw materials found in the possession of any person or persons intending to manufacture the same into such articles and things, and also all tools, machinery, implements, instruments, and personal property found in the place or building where the articles and things described in section one of this act are found or seized and used or intended to be used in the manufacture of such articles or things, may be seized and shall be forfeited. And any police, district or municipal court, or trial justice, may issue a warrant, for the purpose of searching for any of the articles or things mentioned in section one, in the manner provided in chapter one hundred seventy of the General Statutes, and all such things found by an officer in executing such warrant shall be safely kept so long as is necessary for the purpose of being used as evidence in any case, and as soon as may be afterward shall be destroyed by order of the court or justice before whom the same are brought.

Materials for manufacture may be seized and forfeited.

Search warrants may be issued.

AN ACT IN RELATION TO THE APPRAISAL OF ANIMALS DISEASED WITH GLANDERS OR FARCY.

Chap. 160

*Be it enacted, &c., as follows:*

SECTION 1. In all cases of glanders or farcy the appraisal of the animal so diseased shall be based on its value in its diseased condition, and the appraisers shall be the following persons. First, one member of the board of commissioners on contagious diseases among cattle. Second, one veterinary surgeon selected by said commissioner. Third, one reputable person who may be selected by the owner of the animal, if he choose to do so, otherwise the two appraisers above named shall select the third.

Appraisal of animals diseased with glanders or farcy.

SECTION 2. All acts or parts of acts inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed. *Approved March 26, 1879.*

AN ACT IN RELATION TO PROBATE ACCOUNTS.

Chap. 161

*Be it enacted, &c., as follows:*

SECTION 1. When upon the filing of or hearing on any account by a trustee or guardian in the probate court, it appears to the court that the interest of any person unborn, unascertained, or otherwise legally incompetent, is

When interest of a person is not represented, court may appoint guardian *ad litem*.
