
ACTS, 1988. - Chaps. 182, 183, 184.

Chapter 182. AN ACT DESIGNATING A CERTAIN PUBLIC BUILDING FOR HANDICAPPED RESIDENTS IN THE TOWN OF UXBRIDGE AS THE ALBERT J. TANCRELL BUILDING.

Be it enacted, etc., as follows:

The house for handicapped residents constructed under the provision of chapter one hundred and twenty-one B of the General Laws, located on Veteran's parkway in the town of Uxbridge, shall be designated and known as the Albert J. Tancrell Building in honor of Albert J. Tancrell, a founding member of the Uxbridge Housing Authority who served as a commissioner of said authority for forty years. Suitable markers bearing such designation shall be attached thereto by the department of communities and development in compliance with the standards of said department.

Chapter 183. AN ACT FURTHER REGULATING THE CHARITABLE DONATION OF FOOD.

Be it enacted, etc., as follows:

SECTION 1. Section 328 of chapter 94 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 1986 Official Edition, is hereby amended by inserting after the word "served", in line 16, the words:- ; provided, however, that no fee shall be charged for any such permit issued to such corporation.

SECTION 2. Said section 328 of said chapter 94, as so appearing, is hereby further amended by adding the following paragraph:-

The preparation of food in private homes for donation to a nonprofit corporation for distribution or serving by such corporation without charge or at a charge sufficient to cover the cost of handling such food shall not be subject to licensure or regulation. The department of public health shall provide advisory guidelines and interpretations for the safe and sanitary preparation of such food.

Chapter 184. AN ACT EXEMPTING THE POSITIONS OF CLERK TYPIST AND CLERK STENOGRAPHER OF THE FINANCE COMMITTEE IN THE TOWN OF BILLERICA FROM THE PROVISIONS OF THE CIVIL SERVICE LAW.

Be it enacted, etc., as follows:

ACTS, 1988. - Chaps. 185, 186.

SECTION 1. Notwithstanding the provisions of any general or special law, rule or regulation to the contrary, the positions of clerk typist and clerk stenographer of the finance committee in the town of Billerica shall not be subject to the provisions of chapter thirty-one of the General Laws.

SECTION 2. The provisions of section one shall not impair the civil service status of any incumbent of the positions of clerk typist or clerk stenographer of the finance committee in the town of Billerica on the effective date of the act.

Chapter 185. AN ACT DESIGNATING THE BRIDGE ON UNITED STATES HIGHWAY 6 IN THE TOWN OF SWANSEA AS THE MARGARET F. BUTLER GOLD STAR MOTHER MEMORIAL BRIDGE.

Be it enacted, etc., as follows:

The bridge on United States highway Route 6 crossing Cole's river in the town of Swansea shall be designated and known as the Margaret F. Butler Gold Star Mother Memorial bridge. Suitable markers bearing such designation shall be erected thereon by the department of public works in compliance with the standards of said department and as authorized by the federal highway administration.

Chapter 186. AN ACT FURTHER REGULATING CERTAIN GRIEVANCE PROCEDURES.

Be it enacted, etc., as follows:

SECTION 1. Section 8 of chapter 150E of the General Laws, as appearing in the 1986 Official Edition, is hereby amended by adding the following sentence:- Where binding arbitration is provided under the terms of a collective bargaining agreement as a means of resolving grievances concerning job abolition, demotion, promotion, layoff, recall, or appointment and where an employee elects such binding arbitration as the method of resolution under said collective bargaining agreement, such binding agreement shall be the exclusive procedure for resolving any such grievance, notwithstanding any contrary provisions of sections thirty-seven, thirty-eight, forty-two to forty-three A, inclusive, and section fifty-nine B of chapter seventy-one.

SECTION 2. This act shall not apply to any contract provisions
