

For the salary of the surgeon-general, one thousand two hundred dollars. Surgeon-general.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its passage.

AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE EMPLOYMENT OF A SECOND CLERK IN THE BUREAU OF STATISTICS OF LABOR. *Chap. 4*

*Be it enacted, etc., as follows:*

SECTION 1. The chief of the bureau of statistics of labor is hereby authorized to employ a second clerk at a salary of thirteen hundred dollars per annum, to be computed from and after the first day of January in the year eighteen hundred and eighty-four. Second clerk.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its passage. Salary.

AN ACT CONCERNING THE INJURY OR DESTRUCTION OF RAILROAD SIGNALS. *Chap. 5*

*Be it enacted, etc., as follows:*

Chapter one hundred and twelve, section two hundred and seven, of the Public Statutes is hereby amended by striking out the word "electric." Injury to rail-road signals.

AN ACT IN ADDITION TO "AN ACT MAKING APPROPRIATIONS FOR THE MAINTENANCE OF THE GOVERNMENT DURING THE PRESENT YEAR." *Chap. 6*

*Be it enacted, etc., as follows:*

SECTION 1. The sums hereinafter mentioned are appropriated, to be paid out of the treasury of the Commonwealth, from the ordinary revenue, for the purposes specified, to meet expenses for the year ending December the thirty-first, in the year eighteen hundred and eighty-four; to wit:— Appropriations.

SUPREME JUDICIAL COURT.

For the salary of the clerk of the supreme judicial court, three thousand dollars. S. J. C., clerk.

For the salary of the reporter of decisions of the supreme judicial court, three hundred dollars. Reporter.

For the salaries of the officers and messengers of the supreme judicial court, sixteen hundred dollars. Officers and messengers.

For expenses of the supreme judicial court, a sum not exceeding two thousand dollars.
