

ACTS, 1989. - Chaps. 33, 34, 35.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its passage.

Approved April 25, 1989.

Chapter 33. AN ACT EXEMPTING THE POSITION OF CITY AUDITOR IN THE CITY OF EVERETT FROM THE PROVISIONS OF THE CIVIL SERVICE LAW.

Be it enacted, etc., as follows:

SECTION 1. The position of city auditor in the city of Everett shall be exempt from the provisions of chapter thirty-one of the General Laws.

SECTION 2. The provisions of section one shall not impair the civil service status of any person holding the position of city auditor in the city of Everett on the effective date of this act.

SECTION 3. This act shall take effect upon its passage.

Chapter 34. AN ACT EXTENDING THE TIME FOR FILING FOR CERTAIN ABATEMENTS IN THE TOWN OF LEXINGTON.

Be it enacted, etc., as follows:

SECTION 1. Notwithstanding the provisions of section fifty-nine of chapter fifty-nine of the General Laws or any other general or special law to the contrary, the board of assessors of the town of Lexington is hereby authorized to receive abatement applications for the fiscal year nineteen hundred and eighty-seven from those owners of property shown on assessors map 21 whose property was incorrectly assessed until December thirty-first, nineteen hundred and eighty-nine.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its passage.

Chapter 35. AN ACT DESIGNATING THE BRIDGE ON WEST CHESTNUT STREET IN THE CITY OF BROCKTON AS THE AMERICAN LEGION BROCKTON POST #35 MEMORIAL BRIDGE.

Be it enacted, etc., as follows:

ACTS, 1989. - Chaps. 36, 37.

The bridge on West Chestnut street over state highway Route 24 and numbered 006 699 002 in the city of Brockton shall be designated and known as the American Legion Brockton Post #35 Memorial bridge, in recognition of the contribution of said post's past and present members to the defense of this nation and of said post's continuing work to help improve the community. The department of public works shall erect suitable markers bearing such designation in compliance with the standards of said department.

Chapter 36. AN ACT ESTABLISHING THE POSITION OF HIGHWAY SUPERINTENDENT IN THE TOWN OF SANDWICH.

Be it enacted, etc., as follows:

SECTION 1. Notwithstanding the provisions of section one of chapter forty-one of the General Laws, the position of highway surveyor in the town of Sandwich is hereby abolished.

SECTION 2. The board of selectmen of the town of Sandwich is hereby authorized to appoint a superintendent of public works with such responsibility as said board shall from time to time determine including the duties of a highway surveyor under the provisions of section sixty-two of chapter forty-one of the General Laws.

SECTION 3. Notwithstanding the provisions of sections one and two, the incumbent in the position of highway surveyor upon the effective date of this act shall continue to hold such position and perform the duties thereof until the expiration of his term or a precedent vacating of such position.

Chapter 37. AN ACT FURTHER REGULATING USE OF BLUE FLASHING LIGHTS ON CERTAIN MOTOR VEHICLES.

Be it enacted, etc., as follows:

The sixth paragraph of section 7E of chapter 90 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 1986 Official Edition, is hereby amended by inserting after the word "registrar", in line 62, the following words:- (vi) a vehicle operated by a chaplain of a municipal police department while on official duty and only by authority of a permit issued by the registrar.
