

## Chap. 91.

An Act to incorporate the Glendale Company.

*BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows :*

Persons incor-  
porated.

SECT. 1. Lewis Beach, James H. Royce, Samuel Williams, their associates and successors, are hereby made a corporation by the name of the Glendale Company, for the purpose of manufacturing cotton and woollen goods in the town of Stockbridge, in the county of Berkshire, and for these purposes shall have all the powers and privileges, and be subject to all the duties, restrictions and liabilities, set forth in the thirty-eighth and forty-fourth chapters of the Revised Statutes.

Estate.

SECT. 2. The said corporation may hold, for the purposes aforesaid, real estate to the amount of seventy-five thousand dollars ; and the whole capital stock of said corporation shall not exceed two hundred thousand dollars. [*Approved by the Governor, March 17, 1841.*]

## Chap. 92.

An Act to incorporate the Suffolk Iron and Copper Foundry.

*BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows :*

Persons incor-  
porated.

SECT. 1. Thomas Richardson, S. C. Burgess, and George K. Kimball, their associates and successors, are hereby made a corporation by the name of the Suffolk Iron and Copper Foundry, for the purpose of manufacturing iron and copper in the city of Boston, in the county of Suffolk ; and, for this purpose, shall have all the powers and privileges, and be subject to all the duties, restrictions and liabilities, set forth in the thirty-eighth and forty-fourth chapters of the Revised Statutes.

Estate.

SECT. 2. Said corporation may hold, for the purposes aforesaid, real estate to the amount of fifty thousand dollars ; and the whole capital stock of said company shall not exceed the sum of one hundred thousand dollars. [*Approved by the Governor, March 17, 1841.*]

## Chap. 93.

An Act to incorporate the Dracut Paper Manufacturing Company.

*BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows :*

Persons incor-  
porated.

SECT. 1. John H. Richmond, William Wilkins, Perez O. Richmond, their associates and successors, are hereby made a corporation by the name of the Dracut Paper Manufacturing Company, for the purpose of manufacturing paper in the town of Dracut, in the county of Middlesex ; and for this purpose shall have all the powers and privileges, and be subject to all the duties, restrictions and liabilities, set forth in the thirty-eighth and forty-fourth chapters of the Revised Statutes.

Estate.

SECT. 2. Said corporation may hold, for the purposes aforesaid, real estate to the amount of fifteen thousand dollars, and the whole capital stock of said company shall not exceed fifty thousand dollars. [*Approved by the Governor, March 17, 1841.*]
