

city of Boston, for the purpose of affording, by means of a stated contribution from the members, pecuniary assistance to each other in time of sickness; and by the same means to raise a fund, from which there may be made a bestowment of a certain sum upon the widow of any member at the time of his decease, and upon the widower at the decease of his wife; with all the powers and privileges, and subject to all the duties, liabilities and restrictions set forth in the forty-fourth chapter of the Revised Statutes.

SECT. 2. The said corporation may hold, for the purposes aforesaid, real or personal estate, or both, to an amount not exceeding twenty thousand dollars. [*Approved by the Governor, Feb. 22, 1842.*]

An Act in addition to an Act to incorporate Swett's Wharf.

Chap. 18.

*BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

The proprietors of the wharf in the town of Charlestown, now called and known by the name of Swett's Wharf, are hereby empowered to purchase, hold, use and dispose of the following lot of land, being situated in Charlestown, and bounded as follows: southeasterly on Water street, measuring fifty-five feet six inches; southwesterly on Trumbull lane, eighty-eight feet three inches; northwesterly on land of Carey, eighty-four feet four inches; northeasterly on a passage-way and land of one Gould, seventy-five feet three inches; then southwesterly on land now or late of one Haines, forty-nine feet seven inches; then southeasterly on said Haines' land to Water street, containing about thirty rods: and said proprietors shall hold said real estate, with all the powers and privileges, and subject to all the duties and restrictions, mentioned in relation to their other property in the act to which this is an addition. [*Approved by the Governor, Feb. 22, 1842.*]

An Act to change the Name of the Falmouth Academy.

Chap. 19.

*BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

The institution created in the town of Falmouth, in the county of Barnstable, by an act passed and approved the seventh day of March, eighteen hundred and thirty-five, by the corporate name of the Falmouth Academy, may, on and after the passage of this act, take the corporate name of the Lawrence Academy in Falmouth, and by that name shall be known and called.
