

Chap. 12. An Act in addition to an Act to incorporate certain persons into a Company, by the Name of the South Boston Association.

BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows :

Continuation of former act.

SECT. 1. An act passed on the fourteenth day of June, in the year one thousand eight hundred and five, entitled "An Act to incorporate certain persons into a company, by the name of the South Boston Association" shall continue in force until the fourteenth day of June in the year one thousand eight hundred and forty-six ; any thing in the original act, and the acts in addition to the same, to the contrary notwithstanding. And the said corporation shall have every legal remedy in regard to their lands and property, and may maintain any suits or other legal proceedings concerning the same in the same manner as if all the provisions in the acts to which this is in further addition were hereby expressly revived and continued in force.

And of legal remedies therein provided.

Authorizing sales at auction.

SECT. 2. The said association may, at any regular meeting, by a major vote, authorize sales to be made at public auction, of the whole, or any part of their property, and pass deeds in conformity to such sales. [*Approved by the Governor, March 14, 1843.*]

Chap. 13.

An Act to reduce the Expenses of the Office of Adjutant General.

BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows :

Salary.

SECT. 1. The salary of the adjutant general of this Commonwealth, from and after the passage of this act, shall be at the rate of twelve hundred dollars a year, payable quarterly, which shall be in full for all his services.

No clerk allowed.

SECT. 2. The adjutant general shall not be allowed to employ in his office an assistant or clerk, whose salary shall be paid out of the treasury of the Commonwealth.

Office of military store-keeper abolished.

SECT. 3. The office of military store-keeper is hereby abolished.

Further compensation to adjutant general.

SECT. 4. The adjutant general shall receive the further sum of three hundred dollars a year, payable quarterly, which shall be in full for all services performed by him, as keeper of the public magazines, munitions of war, entrenching tools, and all other implements of war belonging to the Commonwealth.

Repeal of former acts.

SECT. 5. All laws inconsistent with this act are hereby repealed. [*Approved by the Governor, March 14, 1843.*]
