provides that said easement shall be used for the purpose of laying, maintaining, repairing, replacing, and using one or more sanitary sewer lines and related sewerage treatment facilities.

SECTION 3. If the aforementioned purpose as described in section two ceases at any time, said easement shall revert to the commonwealth under such terms and conditions as the deputy commissioner shall prescribe.

SECTION 4. The town of Belchertown shall assume the costs of any appraisals, surveys, and other expenses as deemed necessary by the deputy commissioner for the granting of this easement.

Chapter 131. AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE TOWN OF SUDBURY TO REIMBURSE ESTELLE VEE SIMON CERTAIN MONIES PAID AS REAL ESTATE TAXES TO SAID TOWN.

Be it enacted, etc., as follows:

SECTION 1. The town of Sudbury is hereby authorized to reimburse Estelle Vee Simon the sum of five hundred and four dollars and seventy cents paid to said town on real estate taxes which were erroneously assessed for the years nineteen hundred and eighty-one through nineteen hundred and eighty-seven.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its passage.

Chapter 132. AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE REPRESENTATIVE TOWN MEETING FORM OF GOVERNMENT IN THE TOWN OF LEXINGTON.

Be it enacted, etc., as follows:

SECTION 1. Section 1 of chapter 215 of the acts of 1929, as amended by section 1 of chapter 179 of the acts of 1978, is hereby further amended by striking out the first paragraph and inserting in place thereof the following paragraph:-

Upon the acceptance of this act by the town of Lexington as hereinafter provided, the selectmen shall forthwith divide the territory thereof into not less than nine nor more than twelve voting precincts, each of which shall be plainly designated, and shall consist of as nearly equal population as is possible.
