

An Act to incorporate the Proprietors of the Emery House in Springfield. *Chap. 130*

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows :*

SECT. 1. Albert Morgan, Philos B. Tyler and E. D. Beach, their associates and successors, are hereby made a corporation, by the name of the Proprietors of the Emery House, in Springfield; for the purpose of erecting a hotel, or boarding house, in the city of Springfield, and maintaining the same, and the buildings and appurtenances, connected therewith; and, for those purposes, shall have all the powers and privileges, and be subject to all the duties, restrictions and limitations, set forth in the forty-fourth chapter of the Revised Statutes.

Purpose.

Privileges, liabilities, &c.

SECT. 2. The whole amount of real and personal estate, or capital stock, which said corporation may hold, shall not exceed one hundred thousand dollars.

Real and personal estate.

SECT. 3. When any stockholder, in this corporation, shall transfer his stock in this corporation, a certificate of such transfer shall forthwith be deposited with the city clerk of the city of Springfield, who shall note the time when the same was deposited, and record the certificate at full length, on the record book of the city; and no transfer of such stock shall be valid, as against the creditors of such stockholder, until such certificate shall have been deposited and recorded as aforesaid.

Stock, how transferred.

SECT. 4. This act shall take effect from and after its passage. [*Approved by the Governor, March 24, 1854.*]

An Act establishing the Salaries of Certain Public Officers.

*Chap. 131*

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows :*

SECT. 1. The several public officers herein named, shall receive for their services an annual salary, as specified, that is to say: The Secretary of the Commonwealth, the sum of two thousand dollars; the Treasurer and Receiver-General of the Commonwealth, the sum of two thousand dollars; the Auditor, the sum of two thousand dollars; the First Clerk in the treasurer's office, the sum of thirteen hundred dollars; the Second Clerk in the treasurer's office, the sum of twelve hundred dollars; the Clerk in the auditor's office, the sum of twelve hundred dollars; the Sergeant-at-Arms,
