

**Chapter 673. AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE TOWN OF HINGHAM TO CONVEY CERTAIN CONSERVATION LAND.**

*Be it enacted, etc., as follows:*

**SECTION 1.** The town of Hingham is hereby authorized to convey a certain parcel of conservation land located in said town to the commonwealth for highway and bikeway purposes. Said parcel is shown on a plan of land entitled "Plan of Parcels in the town of Hingham Plymouth County to be taken for Highway Purposes by the Department of Public Works" dated June 8, 1989 which is on file in the office of department of public works.

**SECTION 2.** This act shall take effect upon its passage.

**Chapter 674. AN ACT FURTHER REGULATING THE DISTRIBUTION OF LIQUOR PURCHASE IDENTIFICATION CARDS.**

*Be it enacted, etc., as follows:*

Section 34B of chapter 138 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 1988 Official Edition, is hereby amended by inserting after the word "twenty-one", in line 1, the words:- and does not hold a valid drivers license issued by the registry of motor vehicles, pursuant to section eight of chapter ninety, or a valid drivers license issued by the registry or department of motor vehicles of another state, which contains the photograph of the licensee.

**Chapter 675. AN ACT DIRECTING THE REINSTATEMENT OF GLADYS M. AYVAZIAN AS A MEMBER IN SERVICE IN THE TEACHERS' RETIREMENT SYSTEM.**

*Be it enacted, etc., as follows:*

Notwithstanding the provisions of any general or special law to the contrary, Gladys M. Ayvazian shall be eligible to be reinstated as a member in service of the teachers' retirement system as of March eleventh, nineteen hundred and eighty-six upon the completion by said Gladys Ayvazian of six years of continuous service as a teacher beginning on or after said March eleventh, nineteen hundred and

eighty-six, provided, however, she shall repay to the teachers' retirement system an amount equal to any accumulated deductions withdrawn by her therefrom together with regular interest thereon to the date of such payment, and a further amount equal to the total amount received by her as a retirement allowance therefrom together with regular interest thereon to the date of such payment, and a further amount equal to the regular deductions which would have been paid by her had she been a member in service continuously from said March eleventh, nineteen hundred and eighty-six, together with regular interest thereon to the date of such payment. Such payment shall be made in one sum or in installments as the retirement board shall prescribe. Upon the completion of said six years of service and the payment of said amounts, said Gladys Ayvazian shall receive, if otherwise eligible, creditable service for all service rendered after said March eleventh, nineteen hundred and eighty-six. If said Gladys Ayvazian shall fail to complete said six years of service or fails to make such payments, she shall not be so reinstated, and any such payments made by her shall be returned to her, without interest thereon. Any pension, allowance, or other retirement benefit provided hereunder shall be exclusive of and in the alternative to any other pension, allowance, or other retirement benefit including any provided for under any other general or special law.

**Chapter 676. AN ACT EXTENDING THE TIME FOR CANDIDATES FOR STATE OFFICE TO FILE NOMINATION PAPERS.**

*Be it enacted, etc., as follows:*

**SECTION 1.** Section 6 of chapter 53 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 1988 Official Edition, is hereby amended by striking out the last paragraph and inserting in place thereof the following paragraph:-

No person may be nominated as an unenrolled candidate for any office to be filled at a state election, or a city or town election following a primary, if he has been enrolled as a member of a political party, as defined in section one of chapter fifty, during the time prior to the last day for filing nomination papers as provided in section ten, and on or after the day by which a primary candidate is required by section forty-eight to establish enrollment in a political party.

**SECTION 2.** Section 10 of said chapter 53, as so appearing, is hereby amended by striking out the first paragraph and inserting in place thereof the following paragraph:-

All certificates of nomination and nomination papers of candidates for the office of state representative, state senator, executive council, or county office shall be filed with the state secretary on or before the last Tuesday in May of the year in
