

AN ACT TO CONTINUE IN FORCE AN ACT INCORPORATING THE DEDHAM MUTUAL FIRE INSURANCE COMPANY. *Chap. 36.*

Be it enacted, &c., as follows :

SECTION 1. The act of the year one thousand eight hundred and thirty-seven, entitled An Act to incorporate the Dedham Mutual Fire Insurance Company, and all acts in addition thereto or in amendment thereof, shall be, remain and continue in force, from and after the twenty-second day of February eighteen hundred and sixty-five, and said company shall continue to have and enjoy all the powers and privileges, and be subject to all the duties, liabilities and restrictions of a mutual fire insurance company from and after said date, in like manner and to the same effect as if said act incorporating said company had contained no limitation of time. Charter extended without limitation of time.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its passage.

AN ACT TO INCORPORATE THE CHELSEA FIRE INSURANCE COMPANY. *Chap. 37.*

Be it enacted, &c., as follows :

SECTION 1. Jesse Gould, Nehemiah Boynton, Noble M. Perkins, their associates and successors, are hereby made a corporation by the name of the Chelsea Fire Insurance Company, in the city of Chelsea, for the purpose of making insurance against losses by fire; with all the powers and privileges, and subject to all the duties, restrictions and liabilities, set forth in all general laws which now are, or hereafter may be, in force, relating to such corporations. Corporators.

SECTION 2. Said corporation shall have a capital stock of one hundred thousand dollars, divided into shares of one hundred dollars each, with liberty to pay in and increase the same to two hundred thousand dollars, and shall have a right to hold real estate for its own use not exceeding ten thousand dollars. Capital stock and shares.

SECTION 3. Said corporation may commence business when one hundred thousand dollars of its capital stock shall have been subscribed and paid in in cash. Condition of corporate power.

SECTION 4. This act shall take effect upon its passage.
