### AN ACT

Making Appropriations for the Salaries and Expenses of the Railroad Commissioners.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. The sums hereinafter mentioned  
2 are appropriated, to be paid out of the treasury  
3 of the Commonwealth, from the ordinary revenue,  
4 for the purposes specified, to meet expenses for  
5 the year ending on the thirty-first day of Decem-  
6 ber nineteen hundred and two, to wit:—

7 For the salaries of the railroad commissioners,  
8 thirteen thousand dollars. [Rev. Laws, chap. 111.]  
(Appropriation 1901, \$13,000.)

9 For the salary of the clerk of the railroad com-  
10 missioners, twenty-five hundred dollars. [Rev.  
11 Laws, chap. 111.]

(Appropriation 1901, \$2,500.)

12 For the salary of the assistant clerk of the rail-

13 road commissioners, a sum not exceeding twelve  
14 hundred dollars. [Rev. Laws, chap. 111.]

(Appropriation 1901, \$1,200.)

15 For the salary of the accountant of the railroad  
16 commissioners, twenty-five hundred dollars. [Rev.  
17 Laws, chap. 111.]

(Appropriation 1901, \$2,500.)

18 For the salaries and expenses of the steam rail-  
19 road inspectors, a sum not exceeding sixty-six  
20 hundred dollars. [Rev. Laws, chap. 111.]

(Appropriation 1901, \$6,600.)

21 For the compensation of experts or other  
22 agents of the railroad commissioners, a sum not  
23 exceeding five thousand two hundred dollars.  
24 [Rev. Laws, chap. 111.]

(Appropriation 1901, \$4,000.)

25 For rent, care of office and salary of a mes-  
26 senger for the railroad commissioners, a sum not  
27 exceeding five thousand two hundred dollars.  
28 [Rev. Laws, chap. 111.]

(Appropriation 1901, \$5,200.)

29 For books, maps, statistics, stationery, inci-  
30 dental and contingent expenses of the railroad  
31 commissioners, a sum not exceeding three thou-  
32 sand dollars. [Rev. Laws, chap. 111.]

(Appropriation 1901, \$3,000.)

33 For expenses in connection with taking evi-  
34 dence given at inquests on death by accident  
35 upon steam and street railways, a sum not ex-  
36 ceeding two thousand dollars. [Rev. Laws,  
37 chap. 24, sect. 14.]

(Appropriation 1901, \$2,000.)

38 For stenographic report of hearings, a sum not  
39 exceeding twelve hundred dollars. [Rev. Laws,  
40 chap. 111.]

(Appropriation 1901, \$750.)

1 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its  
2 passage.
