

AN ACT MAKING APPROPRIATIONS FOR THE BOARD OF REGISTRATION IN PHARMACY. *Chap.478*

*Be it enacted, etc., as follows:*

SECTION 1. The sums hereinafter mentioned are appropriated, to be paid out of the treasury of the commonwealth from the ordinary revenue, for the salaries and expenses of the board of registration in pharmacy, for the fiscal year ending on the thirtieth day of November, nineteen hundred and twelve, to wit:—

Appropriations, board of registration in pharmacy.

For the salaries of the members, thirty-one hundred dollars.

Salaries.

For travelling and other expenses of the members, a sum not exceeding fourteen hundred and twenty-five dollars.

Travelling expenses.

For the salary and expenses of the agent, a sum not exceeding twenty-two hundred dollars.

Agents.

For a stenographer, witness fees and incidental and contingent expenses, to include the printing of the annual report, a sum not exceeding two thousand dollars.

Stenographer, etc.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its passage.

AN ACT TO REQUIRE THE FURNISHING OF SEATS FOR ELEVATOR MEN. *Chap.479*

*Be it enacted, etc., as follows:*

SECTION 1. All elevators used for the carriage of passengers shall be provided with a suitable seat for the operator in charge of the same.

Seats to be provided in elevators.

SECTION 2. Failure to comply with the provisions of this act shall be punished by a fine not exceeding twenty dollars for each offence.

Penalty.

SECTION 3. This act shall be enforced by the inspectors of factories and public buildings of the district police.

Enforcement of act.

AN ACT TO AUTHORIZE THE TOWN OF NEWBURY TO REFUND CERTAIN INDEBTEDNESS. *Chap.480*

*Be it enacted, etc., as follows:*

SECTION 1. The town of Newbury is hereby authorized to incur indebtedness to an amount not exceeding twenty-three thousand nine hundred and seventy-five dollars for the purpose of renewing or refunding certain outstanding debts of the town as follows: One thousand four hundred

The town of Newbury to refund certain indebtedness.
