AN ACT MAKING THE THIRD DISTRICT COURT OF PLYMOUTH A FULL
TIME COURT.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Section 77A of chapter 218 of the General Laws
2 as most recently amended by section 1 of chapter 675 of the
3 acts of 1958, is hereby further amended by inserting, after line
4 39, the following words:— Third district court of Plymouth.

1 SECTION 2. Section 78 of chapter 218 of the General Laws,
2 as most recently amended by section 2 of chapter 675 of the acts
3 of 1958, is hereby further amended by striking out line 23
4 thereof.
