RESOLVE

Directing the Secretary of the Commonwealth and the Attorney-General to investigate the Advisability of a Compulsory Voting Law.

1 *Resolved*, That the state secretary and the attorney-
2 general are hereby directed to investigate the subject of
3 compulsory voting and related matters, and the advis-
4 ability of legislation thereon, giving particular considera-
5 tion to the advisability of legislation compelling the
6 registration of all persons who are eligible to register.
7 They shall report the results of their investigations, with
8 such recommendations, if any, as they deem best, to the
9 next annual session of the general court, on or before the
10 second Wednesday in January.
