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MEMORANDUM OF COMMISSIONER OF CORPORATIONS AND TAXATION PURSUANT TO GENERAL LAWS, CHAPTER 3, SECTION 7, WITH RESPECT TO PETITION OF ABRAHAM H. KAHALAS FOR LEGISLATION TO REVIVE J. TRACHTENBURG, INC.

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DECEMBER 1, 1953.

*To the Honorable Senate and House of Representatives.*

The above-named petition was transmitted to me by the Clerk of the House of Representatives on November 23, 1953, with the request for a recommendation.

That which is sought in the said petition cannot be accomplished under the General Laws, inasmuch as corporations that deal with real estate must be limited as to their duration. I feel it is necessary that the petition be amended by setting a further term of duration of the corporation to take effect upon its revival. (See chapter 156, section 7.)

The fee required by law has been paid.

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### AN ACT REVIVING J. TRACHTENBURG, INC.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 J. Trachtenburg, Inc., a Massachusetts corporation  
2 incorporated on January eleventh, nineteen hundred  
3 and twenty-eight, under general law, whose term of  
4 duration terminated in the current year by reason of  
5 a provision in its charter that its duration is to be  
6 for a term of twenty-five years, is hereby revived  
7 with the same powers, duties and obligations as if  
8 the term of its duration had not terminated as afore-  
9 said, subject, however, to the provisions of section  
10 seven of chapter one hundred and fifty-six of the  
11 General Laws.
