By Mr. Doyle of Boston, petition of Charles Robert Doyle for an investigation by a special commission (including members of the General Court) relative to the employment of disabled persons. Commerce and Labor.

RESOLVE PROVIDING FOR AN INVESTIGATION AND STUDY BY A SPECIAL COMMISSION RELATIVE TO THE FEASIBILITY OF OBTAINING EMPLOYMENT FOR THE DISABLED.

1 *Resolved*, That a special commission, to consist of two members
2 of the senate, three members of the house of representatives, and two
3 persons to be appointed by the governor, is hereby established for
4 the purpose of making an investigation and study relative to the
5 feasibility of obtaining employment for the disabled. Said commis-
6 sion shall report to the general court the results of its investigation
7 and study hereunder, and its recommendations, together with drafts
8 of legislation necessary to carry such recommendations into effect,
9 by filing one or more reports with the clerk of the house of
10 representatives, at such time as the commission may elect, provided
11 that the commission shall so file its final report on or before the first
12 Wednesday of December in the current year. Said commission may
13 expend, subject to appropriation, the sum of fifty thousand dollars.

By the Clerk of the House of Representatives, the following is published as the report of the Committee on the subject of the proposed amendments to the Constitution of the United States, as passed by the House of Representatives on the 12th day of August, 1857.
