RESOLVE INCREASING THE SCOPE OF THE SPECIAL COMMISSION ESTABLISHED TO INVESTIGATE AND STUDY THE FEASIBILITY OF ESTABLISHING A SOUTHEASTERN MASSACHUSETTS WATER DISTRICT.

1 *Resolved*, That the unpaid special commission, estab-
2 lished by chapter fifty-four of the resolves of nineteen
3 hundred and fifty-one and most recently revived and
4 continued by chapter seventy-one of the resolves of
5 nineteen hundred and fifty-four, to investigate and study
6 the advisability and feasibility of establishing a South-
7 eastern Massachusetts Water District, and certain related
8 matters, shall, in the course of its investigation and
9 study consider the subject matter of current senate
10 document numbered 860, a report of the metropolitan
11 district commission relative to the advisability and
12 feasibility of constructing as a part of the metropolitan
13 water system extensions of its water distributing mains
14 into the cities and towns of Plymouth and Bristol
15 counties.
