## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Seventy-Two.

AN ACT PROVIDING THAT ALL BOOKS OF THE MASSACHUSETTS PORT AUTHORITY WILL BE CONSIDERED PUBLIC RECORDS.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 Notwithstanding the provision of any law, all books and  
2 records of the Massachusetts Port Authority will be considered  
3 as public records.
